Dwight Alan "Dak" Krattli, age 66, of Gravois Mills, passed away Saturday, August 27, 2016, at the University of Missouri Hospital and Clinics in Columbia. He was born October 2, 1949, in Independence, Missouri, the son of the late Vernon and Rose (Hoffmann) Krattli.
