Alberta “Bertie” Mikesell, age 82, of Versailles, passed away Wednesday, December 18, 2013, at the Good Shepherd Care Center in Versailles. She was born October 7, 1931, in Claremont, California, a daughter of the late Harold Aaron and Ethel Alberta (Prettyman) Dohner.

In 1950, she was united in marriage in New Plymouth, Idaho, to Neil Dillon Mikesell, who survives the home.

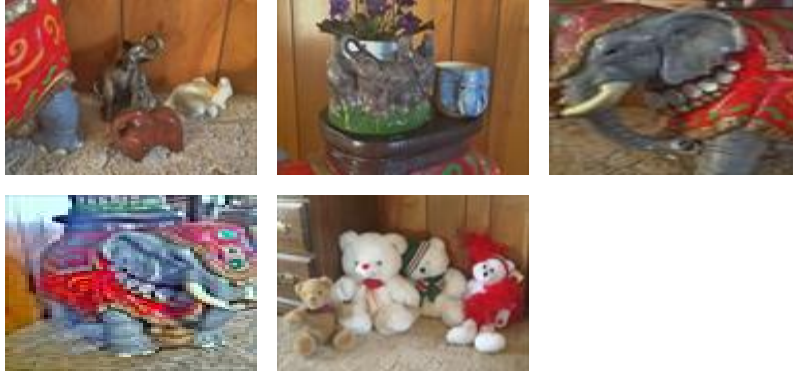
