Andrew Johnson, age 90, passed away Saturday, April 17, 2021 at his sister's home in Clinton, Missouri. He was born March 7, 1931 in Warsaw, Missouri, a son of Robert Phillip and Amanda (Hindman) Johnson.

On November 20, 1954 in Warsaw, Missouri, he was united in marriage to Linda Lee Byrd. Together they shared forty-eight years of marriage before her passing on January 24, 2003.

He was also preceded in death by his parents and siblings, Ralph, Jim, Laura, Carl, Wren, Willian "Dickie", Nadine "Deanie", Leroy, Ira, Cecil, Blanch, Violet and Amel.

All the years, he was an hourly employee and a union member.

He was baptized in Indian Creek from the Big Rock Church on September 20, 2003.
