Bobby Lee Moxter, age 93, of Sedalia, formerly of Versailles, passed away Thursday, March 2, 2023, at Bothwell Regional Health System in Sedalia. He was born January 4, 1930, in St. Louis, Missouri, a son of the late Stanley and Leila (Davis) Moxter.

Bob was a United States Army veteran having served in the Korean Conflict.

He was united in marriage to his surviving wife, Lorraine (Puras) Moxter.

Bob was a business manager for Nissan Motor Corporation, retiring after twenty-five years.

He was very artistic and was an accomplished oil painter. He painted many portraits for family and friends throughout his life.

One day while at the airport, he was under an airplane learning, Charles Lindbergh pulled him out from under the plane and threw him up in the air and told him he would fly someday. He lived out that dream and was a private pilot who was licensed in aerobatics, sea plane and glider.

He attended Westminster Presbyterian Church in Versailles and was a member of the Lions Club and the VFW Post 5172 in Gravois Mills.

In addition to his wife, Lorraine, he is survived by his daughters, Marsha Braden and husband Randy of Ames, Iowa and Michele Martino and husband Stephen of North Attleboro, Massachusetts; grandchildren, Curtis Braden, Maranda Van Cleave, Christopher Braden and Scott Martino; great-grandchildren, Madeline, Macey, Easton, Marlee, Mia, Maverick, Joshua and Ryan and many other relatives and friends. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sons, Mark Preston Moxter and Matthew Clifford Moxter and his brother, Bill Allen.
