



## Bud Kidder

February 25, 1929 - August 16, 2014

Wallace “Bud” Kidder, age 85, of Sunrise Beach, passed away Saturday, August 16, 2014, at his home. He was born February 25, 1929, in Omaha, Nebraska, the son of the late Carl and Rose Kidder.

On October 16, 1954, in Omaha, he was united in marriage to his surviving wife, Beverly (Hill) Kidder.
