Daniel Trent of Pleasant Hill, Missouri, passed away on March 21, 2024 at The University of Kansas Medical Center from complications of lung cancer.

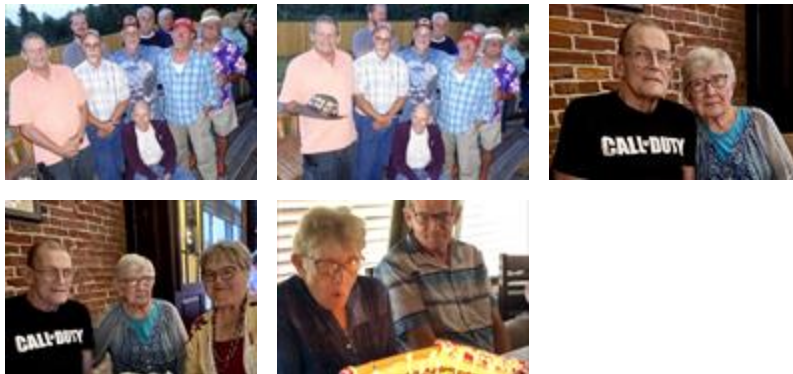
