Donald Gail Gingerich, 84, of Stover, Missouri, died Monday, December 28, 2020 at Capital Region Medical Center. He passed away peacefully with his family by his side.

He was born August 29, 1936 in Kalona, Iowa, to Joe P and Lula (Stutzman) Gingerich.
