Edward Charles Tinberg, age 78, of Gravois Mills, Missouri, passed away Sunday, February 23, 2025 at his home. He was born January 15, 1947 in Kansas City, Kansas, a son of William August and Mary (Armstrong) Tinberg.

Ed was raised in Bonner Springs, Kansas, graduated from Bonner Springs High School, and then Baker University in Baldwin City, Kansas.
