Glenn E. Williams, age 87, of Gravois Mills, passed away, Saturday, December 11, 2010, at the University of Missouri Hospital and Clinics in Columbia. He was born December 23, 1922, in Excelsior Springs, Missouri, the son of the late Glenn E. and Ruth Alta Roe Williams.

On January 25, 1946, at the St. Ann's Church in Excelsior Springs, Missouri, he was united in marriage to Cecelia Cox, who survives of the home.

He was a United States Army veteran having served in WWII, serving in the Pacific Theater as a signal corps radio operator tele type assigned to the United States Army infantry. He was awarded the Asiatic-Pacific Service Medal, the Philippines Liberation Ribbon with 2 Bronze Stars, the WWII Victory Medal, the Meritorious Service Plaque, the Good Conduct Medal, one Bronze Service Arrowhead, and he also received a commendation letter from President Harry S. Truman.

Glenn was an electrician for Evans Electrical Company. He was a member of the IBEW #124 in Kansas City, and was an Eagle Scout. He enjoyed fishing and spending time with neighbors.

In addition to his wife, Cecelia, he is survived by one daughter, Teresa Terzoli and husband Nick of Los Angeles, California; eight grandchildren; five great-

grandchildren; one brother, Kenneth Williams of Austin, Texas; and many other relatives and friends. In addition to his parents he was preceded in death by one daughter, Mary James on September 4, 2000, and one brother, Melvin Williams on July 5, 2007.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 11:00 a.m., Thursday, December 16, 2010, at the Shrine of St. Patrick Catholic Church, in Laurie. Interment will follow in the St. Patrick Cemetery.
