One night after John came home from his stay in the nursing home, he slipped off the side of the bed onto the floor. After trying and trying to get him up, I finally called 911. After reassuring them he was not injured and I only needed assistance in getting him off the floor and back in bed, they said they would send someone from the fire department to assist me. In a few short minutes, Mr. Weaver arrived. I asked if someone else was coming and he said, "no, when they told me he only weighed 175# I told them I could handle it" He grabbed John under the arms and had him back in bed in a minute or less. We came into the living room and talked for a while and he told me he was a bus driver.
