Hiram E. Woods, age 91, of Versailles, passed away Thursday, April 21, 2011, at his home. He was born June 30, 1919, in Marvin, Missouri, the son of the late Joseph Hiram and Mary Lucrease Jobe Woods.

On May 9, 1939, in Versailles, he was united in marriage to Alma Lorene Monteer, who preceded him in death on October 1, 1973. Later, on June 19, 1994, at the Family Worship Center in Versailles, he married Bettie Roark Thacker, who survives of the home.
