Iris Louise (Bartholow) Sandidge, 83, of Fortuna, Missouri, died Saturday, October 17, 2020 at University Hospital, Columbia, Missouri. She was born December 7, 1936, in Mitchell, South Dakota, a daughter of Wayne and Gertrude Bartholow.

On June 30, 1952, in Auburn, California, she married Thomas Edison Sandidge, who preceded her in death on January 12, 1995.

Mrs. Sandidge had lived at Fortuna since 1966 after moving from Marysville, California. She was a member of Bethel Fellowship Church, Fortuna.
