



## Jim Lucas

November 4, 1931 - December 6, 2015

James Nelson Lucas, age 84, of Versailles, passed away Sunday, December 6, 2015, peacefully in his home. He was born November 4, 1931, in Darlington, Missouri to Chambliss Abner and Helen (White) Lucas.

Jim graduated high school and college in Moberly, Missouri. He then joined the United States Army and served in the military police. He loved telling his grandchildren the story about his troop getting ready to board the train for the Korean War. President Truman was there to see them off and when he heard they were being sent to Korea, he said, "I am not sending my Missouri boys to Korea!!" He changed the orders and had them sent to Germany instead.

After his tour in the Army, he attended the police academy in California. After graduating with honors and in the top of his class, he worked as a detective for the Los Angeles Sheriff Department. During this time, he learned to fly fixed-wing aircraft and helicopters. He then went on to be a civilian helicopter instructor for the Army in Texas for our troops during the Vietnam War.

Later, he became a commercial helicopter pilot for a tuna boat fleet in the South Pacific. During turn around trips, he flew for the 1984 Olympics.

In 1983, he met and married the love of his life, Dorothy Gayhart. They moved to Montana, where they enjoyed their beautiful animal-filled ranch. Many

hours were spent enjoying riding their horses, four-wheelers, skiing and ice-skating with their daughters and granddaughter.

During his turn around trips with the tuna boats while in Montana, he flew helicopter search and rescue, Medivac for the hospital and many fire-fighting jobs.

In 1997, they moved back to Missouri to enjoy retirement. Their daughters followed shortly. They opened The Village Shoppe and enjoyed interacting with their beloved community. He will be remembered for his presence in the front window of the Shoppe reading his book, riding his bike with his grandsons around town, making his famous frappes and walking the square with Jasper, his little Shih Tzu.

He is a loving husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather. His most cherished times were those spent with family.

He is survived by his beloved wife and soul mate, Dorothy of the home; his sister, LouAnn Burgess and husband Marion of Lindale, Texas; his son, Ron and wife Tina Lucas of Hammond, Louisiana; Ron's children, Katrina Friedman and Hollie Lucas and their children, Scott, Kamaron, Piper, Alaiyah, Collin and Madison all of Louisiana; Jim's deceased son's daughters, Nikki and Stephanie and their children, Taylor, Justin, Shawn, Seth and Sidd; his daughter, Wende Crowe of Versailles and her children, Nicole Harris and husband Chip and their children, Craedon, Korben and Natalie all of Belle Fourche, South Dakota and Andrew Crowe of Kalispell, Montana and Austin Crowe of Versailles; his daughter, Pam Dykzeul and husband Jim and their children, Brett and his daughter, Brooklyn of Kingsville, Missouri and Courtney Lake and husband Brice, Noah and Skylar, all of Versailles.
