Katherine Kay Plumlee, age 54, of La Monte, Missouri, passed away at Boone Hospital Center in Columbia, Missouri on Sunday, February 11, 2007, following a lengthy and courageous battle with lymphoma.

Memorial services will be at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, February 16, 2007, at La Monte United Methodist Church in La Monte.

Katherine was born in Jefferson City on August 29, 1952, to George William and Clarica Fay Peek. She attended elementary, middle school and two years of high school in the Morgan County R II District in Versailles. She graduated high school at Westport High School in Kansas City.
