Linda Kay Zeigler, age 81, of Versailles, passed away Monday, February 3, 2025 at Golden Age Living Center in Stover. She was born August 10, 1943 at Wichita, Kansas, the daughter of Everett "Pat" and Iva Ferguson.

Linda moved to the area at the age of about 1 ½ with her father, mother, and sister, Dolores. She attended Marvin school until the third grade when her family moved to Versailles and her father and mother divorced. Within a year or so her mother had remarried to Nelson W. Wilson, whom Linda had always spoken of with great fondness.

Linda's passions were her Christian walk, dogs, horses, art, and family. At one time she, her mom, and her step-father, Nelson Wilson, had over 20 Tennessee walking horses and they were very successful in both selling and showing, with one young show mare going on to win top honors in Shelbyville, TN. Celebration, the first time a mare had won in this echelon of walking horse shows. They also raised and sold German shepherd and chihuahua dogs and horned Hereford cattle, all registered.

Linda married the Reverend John Reik at the age of 34 and soon after moved to Nebraska, and then Alaska, for about 10 years. After moving back to

Missouri, she had the privilege to be married to Michael Zeigler – a paramedic – for 15 years before his passing at the age of 54.

Linda is survived by one sister, Dolores Jones; three step daughters, Tammy Fisher and husband Jed, of Marshfield, Wendy Liggett of Eldon, and Patricia Zeigler of Marshfield; seven grandsons, Dustin Zeigler, Kelson Winters, Brandon Winters, Matthew Zeigler, Shaun Winters, CJ Moesch, and Jordan Julian; two great-grandsons, Brayton Winters and Ryder Zeigler; three great-granddaughters, Adilynn Winters, Kysandra Dykes, and Aspen Haas; and many other relatives and friends.
