March 11, 1918 - May 20, 2014

Zera Mae Taylor, age 96, passed away at the Laurie Care Center in Laurie on May 20, 2014 surrounded by her family.

Mae was born to Walter May Mann and Mary Lucinda (Cartwright) Mann on March 11, 1918, in Speedwell, Missouri. At the age of four, she traveled with her parents by wagon to Miller, Kansas, where her father had a job on the Miller Ranch. She remembered riding her pony into Miller to go to school and then staying with another girl in a boarding house in Miller in order to attend school.

She moved to Topeka after high school to become a nanny for a family. During that time, she met the love of her life at a Y.W.C.A. dance and married Loren Roscoe Taylor on October 13, 1940.

She was a loving mother and homemaker and supported her children in every activity they pursued. She was active in the Methodist church and was district president of the W.S.C.S. women's organization.

She enjoyed music all of her life and led the "Ding-a-Lings" for many years during retirement in Florida.

She is survived by son, David Roscoe Taylor and wife Janet Leigh (Frede)

Taylor of Gravois Mills, Missouri; son, Ralph Eugene Taylor and wife Barbara (McCunn) Taylor of Roseburg, Oregon and brother-in-law, Glenn Watson Taylor of San Antonio, Texas. She is also survived by three grandchildren, six great-grandchildren and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins. She was preceded in death by her husband, Loren Roscoe Taylor, sister-in-law, Thelma Schlageter, son, Glenn Leroy Taylor and a grandson, Scott Loren Taylor.
