



## Mark Douglas Oldham

Mark Douglas Oldham, age 59, of Climax Springs, passed away with leukemia, Wednesday, August 13, 2008, at St. John's Health System in Springfield, Missouri. He was born July 27, 1949, at St. Mary's Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri, the son of Sherwin E. and Helen Baker Oldham.

Mark was of the Lutheran faith. He attended Ruskin High School. He moved to the lake 25 years ago. At the time of his death, he owned and operated T & M Drywall. He was a U.S. Marine veteran of the Vietnam War, and had an outstanding record.
