Martin L. White, age 90, of Sunrise Beach, passed away in his home on Monday May 4, 2026. He was born December 17, 1935, in Kansas City, Missouri, a son of the late Forrest and Mable (Martin) White.

Martin grew up in Independence, Missouri and graduated from William Chrisman High School. Following high school he faithfully served his country in the United States Navy.

Martin was united in marriage to his surviving wife, Marcia “Lucille” (Phillips) White, on December 20, 1955.

Upon his return to the Kansas City area, he enrolled in a local engineering college and obtained his Electrical Engineering Degree. He worked at Allied Signal until he retired.

loved dearly.

Along with his wife Lucille White of 70 years, he is survived by sons, Martin R.
