



Mary Frances Schaffter

August 26, 1924 - September 1, 2020

Mary Frances Schaffter, age 96, of Tipton, passed away Tuesday, September 1, 2020, at Capital Region Medical Center in Jefferson City. She was born August 26, 1924, in Morgan County, a daughter of the late Aubrey and Elizabeth (Gerber) Aeschbacher.

On August 25, 1948, at the Bethel Mennonite Church, she was united in marriage to Glenn Schaffter, who preceded her in death on February 14, 1987.

Mary and Glenn founded Schaffter Equipment, a John Deere dealership in Tipton and Versailles in 1960. Later, in 2008, they sold the business to Sydenstricker's and she continued working there until her retirement in 2017.

She enjoyed going to tractor pulls and car races. Mary was also an avid basketball fan, especially high school and Mizzou.

She was a member of the Tipton First Christian Church.

She is survived by her son, Barry Schaffter and wife Becka of Spring Hill, Kansas; daughter-in-law, Cindy Schaffter of Tipton, Missouri; five grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; sister, Ellen Hofstetter of California, Missouri and many other relatives and friends. In addition to her parents and

husband, she was preceded in death by her son, Michael Dean Schaffter and a brother-in-law, Don Hofstetter.

A private family graveside service and interment with social distancing and masks recommended will be held in the Tipton Masonic Cemetery with Pastor Frank Eastman officiating. A celebration of Mary's life will be held at a later date at the Tipton First Christian Church.
