November 7, 1919 - October 9, 2014

Mildred "Mid" Holland, 94, of Barnett, MO, passed away Thursday, October 9, 2014, with her family at her side. Services will be held at 1:00 p.m., Monday, October 13 at the Kidwell-Garber Funeral Home in Versailles, MO, where the family will receive friends from 12:00 Noon until the time of the service at the funeral home. She was born in Des Moines, IA on November 7, 1919, the oldest daughter of Leroy "Roy" Mann Bane and Lois "Marie" Hartsook Bane. On December 22, 1940, she married Norman Donald Holland of Elkhart, IA and they were married 67 years prior to his death on January 12, 2008.

Mid was an active woman who enjoyed bowling, boating, golfing and fishing with Norm. She started golfing in the late 1940's. She grew up on a farm in Iowa, played high school basketball and attended Iowa State University for two years until her marriage. During the war she was a "Rosie the Riveter". While living in Iowa she soloed in a single engine plane. She and Norm lived in Des Moines, Kansas City, Johannesburg, Toronto, and Cleveland before retiring to the lake full time in 1976. Mid was a member of the Rolling Hills Country Club and active in the women's league. She was an avid sports fan, especially the Royals and Chiefs and attended several games. She was a member of the Westminster Presbyterian Church in Versailles. Mid loved living

at the lake and enjoyed watching and feeding the birds, as well as taking in all the nature that surrounded her. She enjoyed doing counted cross stitch and needlework. Her children and grandchildren enjoyed activities and time spent with her, playing board and card games and swimming with her just to name a few. Mid was a loving mother, grandmother and great-grandmother who always enjoyed visits from family, relatives and friends.

Survivors include her 2 daughters, Dianne Lovan (Frank), Barnett, MO, and Susan Herrman (Bill), Overland Park, KS; grandchildren, Wendy Cline (Bruce), Broomfield, CO, Renee Strotkamp, Barnett, MO, Emily Connelly (Steven), Olathe, KS, and Jennifer Campbell (Bart), Kansas City, KS; five great-grandchildren, Jordan and Holland Cline, Colorado, and Hannah, Isaac and Micah Connelly, Olathe, KS.
