It's the former Frost Nursing Home, about two-thirds of which he built. When the (big, old, empty) house was for sale in 1977, my wife Judy and I looked at it, then decided it would be a much bigger project than we wanted to tackle. Oral came 'round to where I was working one day, building an apartment, and said he and his parents thought I was the right guy to convert their old house into an apartment building. He wanted to know if we'd please come back and take another look. I guess partly because of his confidence in me, we ended up doing some creative financing, moved in, and started working on the place. By 1984, I had finished building the last of 7 apartments, and I still own the place today, 41+ years after its purchase. It's been fun sometimes, a real pain at other times, but always interesting.
