Paul G. Leavell, age 89, of Sunrise Beach, passed away Thursday, September 20, 2012, at Landmark Hospital in Columbia. He was born May 25, 1923, in Fulton, Indiana, a son of the late Clyde and Ruth Marsh Leavell.

On September 25, 1942, in Fulton, Indiana, he was united in marriage to Donna L. Sixbey, who preceded him in death on August 7, 2012.

Paul owned and managed Arrowhead Angus Farms in Logansport, Indiana for many years. After retiring to the Lake of the Ozarks, he became the onsite resident manager of MM RV/Boat Storage in Sunrise Beach for seven years and also worked part-time for the Convention and Visitor Bureau in Osage Beach.

Paul is survived by his daughter, Connie Hutchens and husband Richard of Sunrise Beach; his grandson, Grant Hutchens and wife Pam; his great-grandchildren, Jace and Mia Hutchens; his brother, James Leavell of Cheyenne, Wyoming; and many other relatives and friends. In addition to his
