Theron Burger Hitchcock, age 86, of Camdenton, former resident of Versailles for 57 years, passed away Wednesday, November 22, 2006, at his home. He was born August 28, 1920 in Jamaica, Vermont, a son of the late Phillip and Jerusha Bell Hitchcock.

He was united in marriage on October 12, 1949 with Betty Jean Porter.

Mr. Hitchcock graduated from Vermont State School of Agriculture in 1940 with an Associates Degree.
