William "Bill" Irl Niermeyer, 74, of Jefferson City, passed away Saturday, January 23, 2021 in Springfield.

Bill was born July 9, 1946, the son of Mariana Hotsenpiller Niermeyer and Andy Niermeyer of Syracuse, Missouri.

Upon graduation in 1964 from Tipton High School, he entered the United States Navy where he was stationed at Navcommsta, Greece and was honorably discharged in 1967. Bill retired on September 5, 2008, after 41 years of employment with Ozark Airlines/TWA/American Airlines.

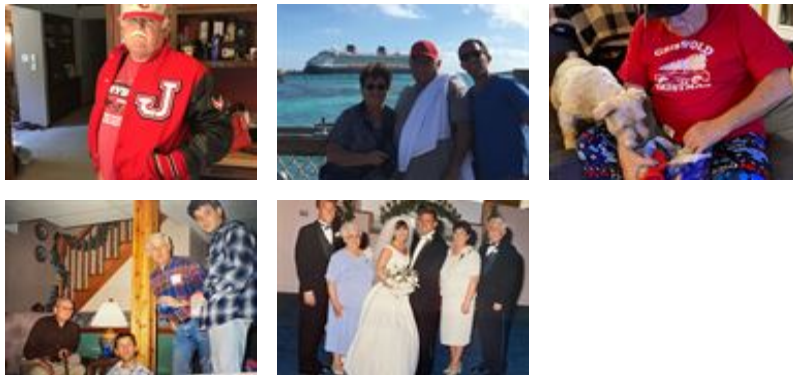
