John Lyles Woolery, age 90, of Versailles, passed away Wednesday morning, January 26, 2005 at the Good Shepherd Care Center in Versailles. He was born May 31, 1914 near Glensted, Missouri, the son of Charles and Mattie Lyles Woolery.

He was united in marriage on December 23, 1932 with Lucille Kays.

Mr. Woolery graduated from Versailles High School in 1931. He was a farmer, worked at M.F.A. for several years, the Versailles Special Road District, and retired from the Pool Table Factory in Tipton. He was a member of Glensted United Methodist Church, having joined in 1921. He was a deputy sheriff for the Morgan County Sheriffs Department under Sheriff J.T.
